Tickets will be \$8 will be on sale before school from Monday, 13th November.





School Parking

Student safety is of the utmost importance at Burnside. I would like to remind parents that there is no parking in the school grounds between the hours of 7.45am and 4.15pm, unless you need disability access for a student. When entering or leaving the school, the entrance gate for the car park should not be used at any time by pedestrians. Please remind your child to use the crossing at the hall if you are not accompanying them.

Morning Play Time

After the 8.30am bell students are to place their bags on their class line. Students are no longer permitted to play under the COLA where the class lines are. This will hopefully prevent students falling over bags and bags and lunches being damaged. Students will still have plenty of room to play safely on the netball court and handball area. Students and parents are still able to sit at the silver chairs and tables in the morning. We welcome parents who wish to come in for a quick chat in the morning, please come to the office, where the staff will call the teacher or arrange a time that suits you to meet.

Waste Free Lunch & Recess on Thursday 16th November

Stage 1 has been learning about the importance of taking care of the environment. To help all students think about what they can do to conserve the environment Burnside is having a waste-free recess & lunch day on Thursday 16th November.

We ask that your child's recess, lunch and crunch & sip contain as few items as possible that are thrown away. Ideally, your child's recess, lunch and crunch & sip will only contain items which can be eaten, composted, recycled or reused.

Reusable containers are a handy way to pack a waste free lunch. They also make it easy to buy food and drink in bulk (instead of in single servings) which can save money over time. Packing a waste free lunch also promotes healthy eating and may provide a better understanding of the actions we can take to reduce our waste.

A WASTE FREE LUNCH MAY INCLUDE:

- Sandwich in a cloth serviette or reusable container
- Yoghurt from larger tub in a reusable container
- Nuts from larger packet in a reusable container
- Piece of fruit (skins or core can be put in compost or worm farm)
- Cheese and crackers in a reusable container
- Juice or water in a reusable drink bottle

2018 Classes and Organisation

We will shortly begin our planning for the school organisation for 2018. The number of classes in our school is determined according to the Department of Education's staffing formula. Class size and allocation is also formed through this process. Due to our small school size, every student leaving or starting school affects this determination.

Therefore I ask that if you know your child will not be returning to Burnside next year please let us know in writing of where they will be moving to. Staff will spend many hours formulating classes however best laid plans will often need revising when our numbers change at the start of the year.

Staff consider many factors when formulating class lists such as academic ability, attitude and commitment towards learning, social well-being and friendships that support classroom learning. Social friendships 'best friends' are often not the best learning partners within rooms especially in years 3-6. Teachers therefore look at who makes great learning and collaborative teams while considering the resilience and wellbeing of each student.

If you have concerns regarding your child's future development that you have not raised with their classroom teacher or myself that may/will impact their future development/ class placement or social wellbeing please do so in person or in writing within the next few weeks so these concerns can be addressed and/or considered during our planning process.

COSfest

Last night students form Burnside Movie Makers hit the red carpet at Cumberland High School. It was the 2nd annual COSfest. Burnside entered seven films that were very competitive in their field. Families enjoyed refreshments and walk down the red carpet before entering the big hall to watch a number of short films made by the students in our community of schools.

Instruments will be chosen for students entering Junior Band in 2018 later in the term so please do not hire an instrument until it has been assigned.
